Gift to help build Jewish museum

CLEVELAND -- A Cleveland broadcasting mogul will donate \$6 million to build a nonprofit museum of Jewish history.

Seventy-two-year-old Milton Maltz's family foundation is making the donation. Maltz is a resident of Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, and is chairman of the Cleveland-based Malrite Company.

The museum will occupy a 15,000 square-foot building next to the suburban branch of the Temple-Tifereth Israel in Beachwood.

It will open in 2004 to coincide with the centennial of the Jewish Community Federation in Cleveland.

The federation will raise \$4 million to complete the museum, which is estimated to cost \$10 million.

The museum will include displays from the Temple's renowned collection of Judaica and films on Cleveland Jewish history.
